An Introduction to Communicable Diseases

COURSE OBJECTIVE

To review the basic information regarding the transmission of common communicable diseases and to provide the chiropractor with the guidelines to reduce the incidence of the transmission of these diseases in the office

All of courses are presented in the following format:

- Each course is in the format of a narrated slide presentation. Each slide in the course has accompanying narration and presentation moves through the slides automatically.
- The doctor viewing the presentation may not move forward to the next slide until the narration of the current slide is completed.
